# Reflections on a Coastal Journey By the Eighth Grade

*The eighth grade class recently returned from their eighth grade trip. They camped and canoed along the Maine Island Trail for seven days on a trip led by Kroka Expeditions and chaperoned by 8th grade teacher Carmen Maciarello and Marketing and Development Coordinator Caitlin Elberson.*

Here are their reflections:

## **Larkspur Gunther and Michaela Nemeth**

We started our eighth grade camping trip with a train ride to Portland, Maine. Everyone had mixed views and expectations on what awaited us. Some thought that we would be sea kayaking. Others thought we would be canoeing on the open ocean. The flurry of conversations on the train car was filled with doubts and fears but were mixed with excitement and enthusiasm for the upcoming adventure.

## **Nicholas Biffis, Benjamin Otto-Horan, and Pio Mistretta**

During our trip, we had four instructors: Mathias, Nicole, Tom and Elisa. Mathias and Nicole are both from Ecuador. In addition to working with school groups in the United States, Mathias and Nicole work at Nahual, a sister school to Kroka in Ecuador. Mathias sustained an injury about a year ago and had to go back to our base camp a few days into our trip. Nicole is an avid kayaker and climber who works as a biologist around the Galapagos Islands. Mostly she focused on cooking, crafts and general support during our trip.

Tom, our main instructor (who participated in the Kroka Vermont semester program in '06) knew a lot about Maine. He grew up right outside of Portland, about four hours from our base camp. He excels at many outdoor survival skills, including firemaking and lodge building.

Elisa was new to Kroka but helped us with sawing firewood and cooking. In general, Kroka instructors are very supportive and open to everyone. If you go to Kroka you can expect to have a great time.

## **Juliana Davis, Annie Jones, and Lauren Mitchell**

To travel the ocean's surface was like tip-toeing across the looking glass; it was amazing and breathtaking. The first few days of paddling were days of loneliness because of the fog that completely concealed the islands around us.

Most of the time the water was a murky blue but at some islands the water was a turquoise blue and looked very welcoming but sadly it was very, very cold. Near the end of our trip we had a big surprise which was the sun. When the sun dug its way through the mist and fog, we were able to see all the island around us. It was like finding yourself in a postcard.

In the canoes the fog was rolling in and it felt as if we were all alone. Turning our heads we saw dozens of seals. As the day wore on, the fog started to clear and small islands came into sight. Some of us heard people say, "shhhh," and we looked and saw baby seals flopping and crying for their mamas.

On the island we saw bald eagles perched on the trees or flying over our heads. One day, on an island, we collected mussels and ate them for breakfast, lunch and dinner the next day! The beaches of all the islands were full with treasures such as crab shells, sea shells and snails. The wildlife was very different compared to the everyday life we see in Pennsylvania. The beach was wide and came abruptly to the tree line. Large rocks jutted out and faded into an equally rocky beach. Many beaches were like this and others were far more sandy.

Tom's voice filtered through the thin sides of the tent. We could hear our classmates getting up, ready for another day where we would be traveling by canoe to our next home. After a breakfast of kasha (buckwheat), cheese and eggs, we efficiently packed up camp, loading our gear into the three canoes, each one holding seven people.

When we got a little bit away from the island, we noticed the roughness of the waves crashing against our boats. We were planning to spend the last two days of our trip on Long Island, but it soon became apparent that the waves were growing in size and strength and we would have to stop at the closest island. Once we safely landed on Tinker Island, we had to portage all of our gear and boats to our camp 3/4 of a mile away.

We were surprised that when we got to camp it was only lunchtime. Even though the morning had been so rough and tedious, the rest of the day was very enjoyable. For dinner we got into groups of two or three and started our own fires, then we cooked a delicious dinner of hot dogs and potatoes over them. When the sun went down, it was time for bed. We were all exhasuted and gratefully climbed into our sleeping bags. The days at Kroka seemed like weeks, but they were filled with new and exciting things, keeping our minds off of home.

Throughout the trip, two of the most often heard remarks were "I'm cold" or "I'm hungry." Most of the time it was rainy, foggy and cold. A welcome relief from the none too beautiful weather were the hot meals, cooked over an open fire. Every day, three of us were the cooks for the day. Throughout the day, we worked up quite an appetite canoeing, carrying all of our gear, and setting up camp. Despite the proverb "hunger is the best spice," some people still didn't like our diet, which consisted of almost all grains and starches. Our only fruit was some apples and we only had a few vegetables: carrots, potatoes, onions. A few times we collected our own food - seaweed and so many mussels that we ate them for four straight meals.

On the last day, the weather finally changed for the better. The sun came out in full splendor and the ocean looked like the blue Carriibbean. We lay on the ground and soaked up the sun, so happy to be warm and dry.

PH: I think one of the most awesome and most memorable moments for me from our Kroka Expedition was when we had to clean ourselves somehow.

Jharna:Yeah! I remember that we could either clean ourselves with nice warm water or we could jump into the icy ocean.

PH: For me, the thought of jumping in the ocean water seemed rather dumb, since the temperature outside was extremely cold, there was no sun at all, and the wind was blowing pretty hard.

JH: Unfortunately for me, half the boys in our class went right away and jumped without hesitation. Not wanting to be one of the only boys to not jump in, I forced myself to jump into the coldest water I have ever felt in my life.

PH: Yeah. Everyone tried not to be profane as they screamed and splashed in the freezing water.

## Sharing Cultures

When we think of Poland, we might envision war-torn villages from a tragic past. Or, if we're thinking food, we might imagine a delicious pierogie. We might not know that Poland was the first country in Europe to pass a constitution or, like me, realize that they have the financial ability to send a group of 7th grade students to visit Kimberton Waldorf School this month on an adventure of a lifetime!

"The whole adventure was like a multi-dimensional reunion captured in a real-life fairytale," explained Benjamin Burg, teacher of the 7th graders from Primus Foundation out of Warsaw, Poland, and a KWS alumnus from the Class of 1985.

Benjamin explained that the economy is thriving in Poland right now and that he is fortunate to have purchased a piece of property before the prices started going sky-high over the last few years. Other stories that he shared, including the rise of metropolitan areas full of glamour, as well as rural farms and small villages where everyone knows each other, helped to dispel some of the unwarranted images that harbored in my mind. The 7th graders from Warsaw may have names like Maciej and Sergio, but they looked like typical American 13-year-olds wearing jeans and sporting T-shirts.

“One of the English teachers at the school where I work asked me if I knew of any schools in the United States that might be interested in an exchange with our students,” Benjamin said. “Our students travel a couple of times a year, mostly to European countries and China. There was an interest in having our bi-lingual students practice in a native English-speaking country and my first thought was Kimberton.”

Many KWS parents hosted the students for the week that they were here. By opening their homes, they extended the exchange experience to include an intimate setting in which they could learn about the students’ particular interests, the foods they eat, and the music they listen to. What many of the hosts found is that there wasn’t as huge a gap as one might anticipate given that the Polish students live thousands of miles away.

“Before the girls arrived from Poland, I didn’t know if I was going to like it,” explained Jillian Belshaw, a KWS 7th grader. “I wasn’t sure how it would be because they were from a different country. After I met them both, I was impressed with how good their English was. We liked the same things and shared the same interests. We got along very well and it was fun hanging out with them. It was interesting having people from a different country staying in our house. I would love for them to come back and visit us again.”

The visit wasn’t only a social one, however. “I teach the students U.S. History and Ecology,” Benjamin added. “The program at Kimberton was to review early American History along with biographies of historical figures with an emphasis on local people.”

According to Benjamin, the children from Poland absolutely loved Kimberton. “Many told me that they wish they could stay longer,” Benjamin shared. “Everyone at Kimberton did a wonderful job to make our children feel welcome.”

And how did the KWS students enjoy the visit to the school? “I believe the Kimberton students had a great time, too,” Benjamin said. “Watching all the hugs in the parking lot and seeing them running down the road as we drove away making their last farewell, well, that summed up the trip.”

Comments from parent Barbara Belshaw, host family

When we signed up to host two Polish girls travelling to visit Kimberton Waldorf School, we had no idea what to expect. As the date of their arrival approached we started getting excited but also a bit apprehensive. What if the girls didn’t fit in with our family? Would we be able to communicate with them? What would they like to eat?

Any concerns we had quickly vanished upon meeting our Polish guests! Not only were they outgoing, lovely girls, but they spoke near-perfect English. Our first night together was full of questions and lively dialogue. After that we all fell into a new routine. Having the girls in the house added an air of excitement for all of us. They were a welcome addition and the week passed all too fast. When we took the girls to school on their last day it was hard saying goodbye. The visit was an enriching experience for our entire family and we are thrilled we were able to participate.
