## Community Spirit Fund Hits Last Year's Total!

With just weeks left before this year's Community Spirit Fund drive comes to a halt, we have made significant milestones. Already, we have raised \$220,000 in gifts and pledges out of our \$250,000 goal or 88 percent! 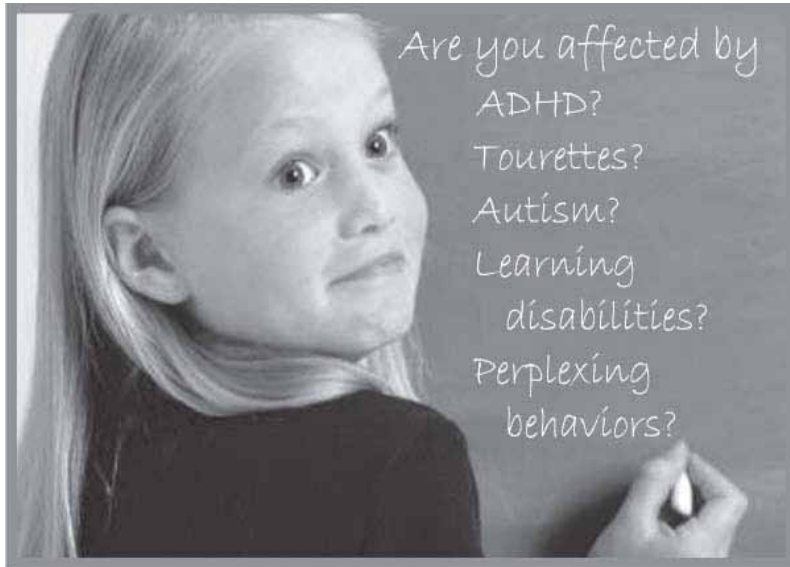
