Dental and/or physical exams are required by the Pennsylvania School Health Act for new students and for those students entering the grades noted below. It is strongly urged that the examination be done by your family physician or dentist, especially in the case of kindergarten children. However, the school will provide a free examination by a doctor and dentist.

The required forms are enclosed. If the exams are done privately, the completed forms are to be returned to the school office **no later than September 1**. Please indicate below whether your child will be seen by your family doctor/dentist or by the doctor/dentist provided by the school, and return this form as soon as possible.
